TWO SUCCESSES AT THE FRANK AND SUE MAYBORN CAMPUS CENTER

The oldest continuously operating college in the state, UMHB has been a pillar of Texas education since 1845. Since then, the university has grown to keep pace with both infrastructure and student body population. Built in 1957, the J.E. and L.E. Mabee Health Complex housed P.E. and athletics, and was renovated in 1980 and 1995 to accommodate more students. Looking to the future, the capital campaign "Challenge Beyond 2000" aimed to give the campus a much-needed wellness and recreation facility that could be expanded with the student body. Dedicated in February 2005, the Mayborn Campus Center included the Mabee and added classrooms, labs, locker rooms, and a new fitness center. In 2010 the university purchased from Marathon Fitness 20 pieces of equipment and 26 spin bikes to upgrade its large cardio theater. Previously, the cardio had been a mix of several brands which made service difficult. Their new purchase was entirely Precor brand equipment, making service and preventative maintenance easy. In 2015, after 5 years of superb reliability, service and low cost of ownership, Marathon Fitness was awarded the contract again to replace all existing cardio.
